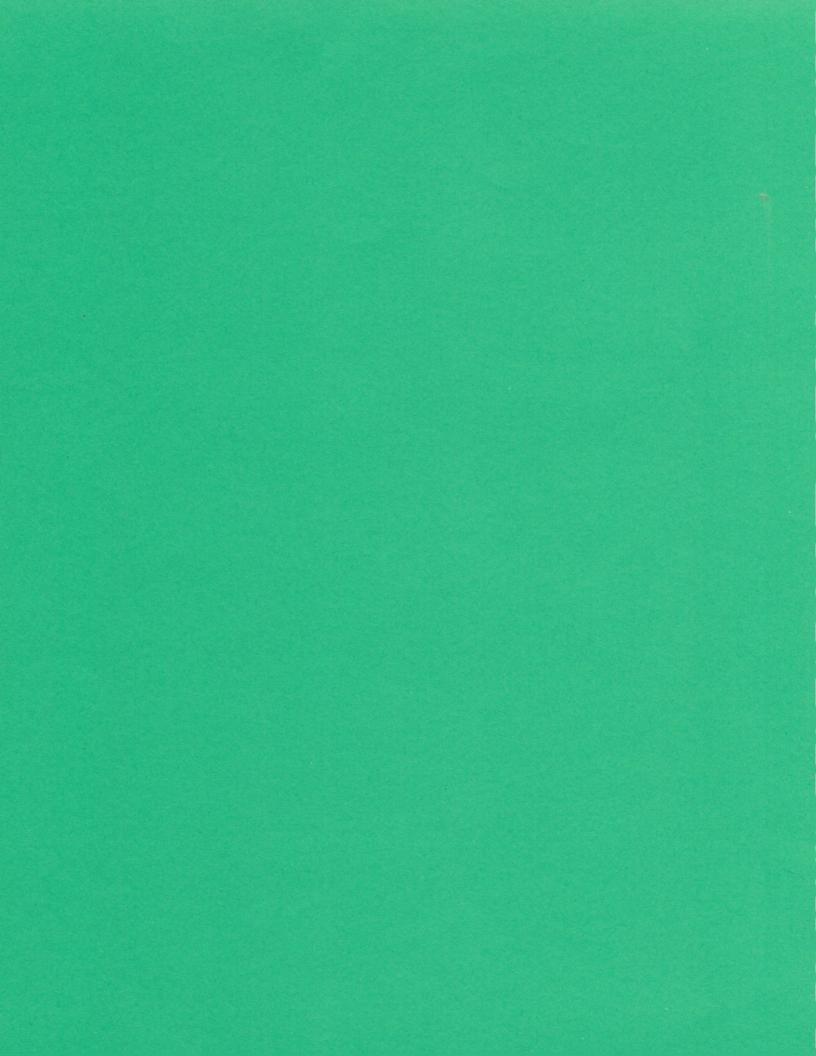
- Help yourself and your family.
- Help your immediate neighbors.
- Go to the Command center at the LDS Ward Building.
- Assist as directed by the command center leaders.

The Green cardstock card found in the binder.

You will notice that there is a piece of green cardstock in the Grab & Go Binder. This is a critical piece of the kit. In an emergency such as an earthquake, the biggest priority is finding out who needs help. There are universal colors that are used by emergency response teams to signify the status of a home and the residences therein. A green card that is placed on the window or door so that it can be seen from the street will notify any emergency response people that everyone in the home is ok.

If everyone in the home is ok and there are not any immediate needs, please place this piece of green cardstock somewhere that it will be visible from the street. That will by the sign to those trying to get to those in need that there are not any immediate needs in your home.

If there are children in the home and there are more than one adult and everyone is fine, then one adult can stay with the children and the other can assist with the needs of our neighbors. What will be the most productive is to see if your immediate neighbors have a specific need and then go to the LDS meetinghouse for your neighborhood area. You will find there a team of people who will have supplies and a plan to assess the entire neighborhood. You will be asked to go with another individual to check on a few homes in your area and find out what the needs are so we can get the assistance to those with the most critical needs. This will be repeated until we have checked on every home in the neighborhood.



FIRST AID QUICK GUIDE

Hands Only CPR

Call 911

Push hard and fast at the center of the chest

IMPORTANT: Hands-Only CRP is most effective if used after you SEE a teen or adult suddenly collapse. If you are trained in conventional CPR, you should use it if victim is found unconscious or is a child / Infant, or is a victim of drewning, drug overdose or collapse due to breathing problems.

Major Bleeding

- Call 911 and put on gloves (or a plastic bag) Have person lie down with head lower than
- Remove obvious objects from wound, but don't clean it.
- If organ have been displace, do not push them back in, simply cover the wound.
- Apply direct pressure with gauze / clothing until bleeding stops (don't "look" for at least 20 min), and apply pressure around deeply embedded objects, not over them.
- Do not remove gauze / bandage. Simply keep adding more as needed
- If limb (arm / leg) is bleeding, elevate it.

Major (not minor) Burns:

- Call 911
- Do not remove clothing
- Do not immerse in cold water
- ✓ Begin CPR if needed
- Elevate burned parts of body above heart if possible
- Cover burn with a cool, moist, sterile bandage or cloth or towel

Hypothermia

- Call 911
- Begin CPR if necessary
- Protect from wind & cover head
- Remove wet clothing, but do not massage / rub
 - Do not use hot water / heating pad and do not apply anything hot or warm to limbs.
 - Apply warmth to center of body only

Conventional CPR

- Call 911
- **Infants**: Place 2-3 fingers below nipple line. 30 (1/2 1 in) compressions. 2 gentle breaths until chest rises. 100 comp/min
- Children: Use 1-2 hands in center of chest. 30 (1-1 ½ in) compressions. 2 breaths until chest rises. 100 comp / min
- Adults: Use 2 hands. 30 (1-2 in) compressions in center of chest. 2 long breaths until chest rises. 100 comp / min
- IMPORTANT: This list is only a reminder for those certified in CPR. It is not meant to train how to properly perform CPR.

Shock

Call 911

- Have person lie down (on their side if vomiting) with head lower than body unless it causes pain, then have them lie flat
- Treat any obvious injuries and give CPR if needed Keep person warm....give blankets
- Keep person as still as possible and encourage them.
 - Do not let the person eat / drink

Choking

- Give 5 back blows between shoulder blades w/ heel of hand
- Give 5 thrusts (Heimlich)
- Repeat until item is dislodged
- Call 911 once item is dislodged or after 1-2 minutes.
- **Heimlich on conscious victim:** Wrap arms around person's waist. Position your fist above their navel and grab it with other hand. Push hard w/ quick, upward thrust.
- Heimlich on pregnant / obese: Place hands higher at base of breastbone.
- **Heimlich on unconscious:** Do not perform. Lie on back and dislodge item if possible. Then, do CRP instead.
- **Heimlich on infant:** Give 5 back blows with them lying facedown on your forearm over thigh. Flip over onto back and use 2 fingers at center of breastbone. Give 5 compressions.

Heat Stroke

- Move into shady / air conditioned space and call 911 Do not immerse in cold water
- Cover with damp sheets, spray with water and fan Have person drink anything without alcohol or caffeine

UTILITY SHUT-OFF

Know how to shut of all your utilities and where the shut-offs are, inside and outside the house.

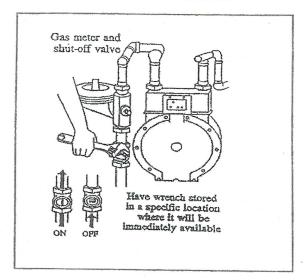
1. NATURAL GAS—Sniff for gas leaks, If you smell gas or there is significant structural damage to your home, turn off the gas.

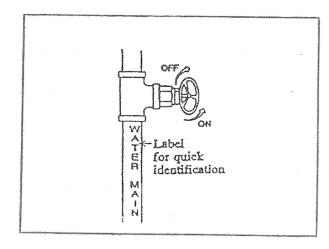
"DO NOT TURN OFF IF NO LEAK IS SUSPECTED. If you turn the gas off, you will need a professional to turn it back on." FEMA

The meter shut-off valve is located next to the meter. Use a wrench to turn the valve a quarter turn in either direction to the "off" position. Notify the gas company or 911 of the gas leak. DO NOT attempt to turn the gas back on!!!

Depending on the severity of the emergency, and the number of meters that have been turned off, you may have to wait some time for your gas service to be rectared as a few forms.

service to be restored, even if there is no damage to the gas pipelines in your area.





NOT TOUCH or attempt to operate any electrical appliances or switches. If possible, locate the electrical service panel inside your home. Open the metal panel on the box and turn the switches to the "off" position or pull out the main fuse.

If you are unable to locate the internal service panel, or unable to get to it, find the electrical "meter" box on the outside of your house and turn the switch to "off".

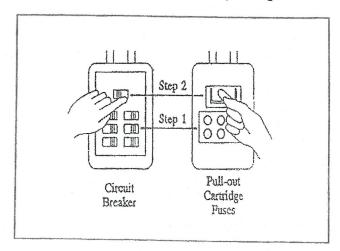
2. WATER—Shut off the main water valve to keep contaminated water from entering the house.

If there are water leaks in your home or between your home and the meter, the water valves should be turned off to maintain pressure.

3. ELECTRICITY

If there are downed power lines STAY AWAY, DO NOT TOUCH!

How to Strap Your Water Heater

These instructions are for installing a water heater restraint for a water heater on a straight wall using the conduit method:

- 1. Mark the water heater 9" down from the top and approximately 4" up from the top of the controls. Locate the wood studs in the wall on both sides of the water heater.
- 2. Using a stud finder or other appropriate methods, locate the closest stud behind and to one side of the water heater.
- 3. Transfer the marks on the water heater horizontally to the adjacent wall where the stud identified in step 2 was located.
- 4. Drill a 3/16" diameter and 3" deep pilot hole at the marked locations for the 1/4" diameter by 3" long lag screw.
- 5. Measure around the water tank and add 2" to the measurement. Cut two pieces of 3/4" x 24 gauge perforated steel plumbers tape to this length. Place a bolt with the washer through the hole of one end and bend out 90 degrees as close to the edge of the washer as possible. Most plumbers tape comes with 1/4" diameter holes 1" apart with 1/8" diameter holes in between. The tape can be easily broken at the smaller holes by grabbing it with pliers and bending it several times.
- 6. Place the tape around the tank and place the bolt with the washer through the nearest hole in the end of the tape. Place a washer and nut on the bolt and tighten. The tape should be tight. If the tape is not tight, remove the bolt, place it through the next adjacent 1/4" hole and tighten.

If you strap your water heater and fit it with a flexible gas supply line, you will reduce the risk of a fire or explosion from a gas leak after an earthquake. If your water heater does not have a flexible gas supply line, contact a licensed plumber to install one.

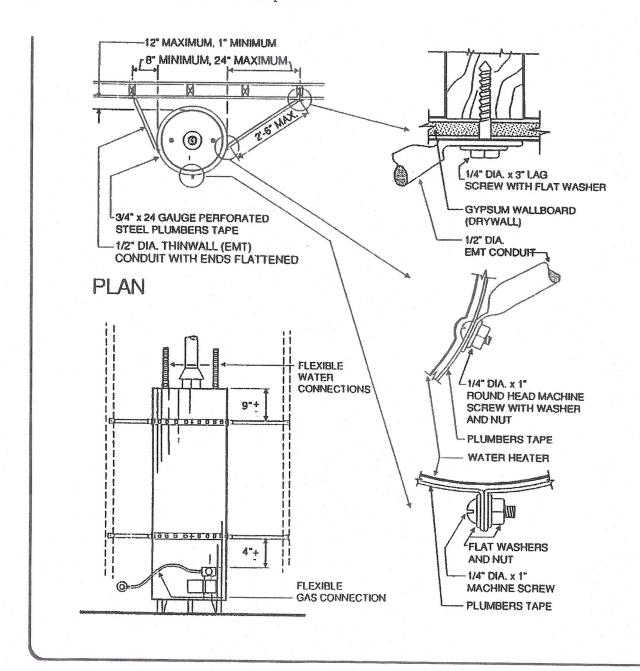
- 7. Using a straight stick, place the end at the hole in the wall with the side of the stick against the side of the tape around the tank. Measure the distance from where the stick touches the water heater to the hole in the wall. Add 1" to this measurement and cut 1/2" diameter conduit to this length. Repeat this for each piece of conduit.
- 8. Using a hammer or vise, flatten 1" at each end of the 4 pieces of conduit. Be sure to flatten both ends of each piece of conduit in the same plane.
- 9. Drill a hole in one end of each conduit approximately 1/2" from each end. Measure 1" from each end and bend up approximately 45 degrees. This angle will have to be corrected slightly as the work progresses. Hold the conduit on the wall with the hole in the conduit over the hole in the wall, and mark the other end at one of the holes in the plumbers tape. Mark the holes in the tape and on the tank and conduit. Take down the conduit and drill a hole at the mark for the bolt through the flattened end of the conduit. Repeat for the conduit on the other side.

- 10. Loosen the strap around the tank and place a bolt with the washer from the inside through the holes in the tape at all locations. Tighten the tape around the tank so that the bolts are at the marks on the tank. It may be easier to do one side of the tank at a time because positioning the tape can be difficult. Place the conduit on the bolt protruding from the strap and place a washer and nut on the bolt and tighten. (A 4d finish nail inserted in the slot in the bolt will prevent
- the head from turning.) Position the opposite end at the hole in the wall and insert the lag screw with the washer and tighten. Do not drive the lag screw with a hammer.
- 11. Repeat the above procedure for the rest of the conduits.

NOTE: The 1/4" x 1" bolts referred to in the above are known as 1/4" x 1" round head machine screws with a nut.
